Bairro Novo

The new Mayor of Cubal knew of the work of RISE, and pursued a partnership to build a school for kids of Bairro Novo, who had no access to education. In 2021, many generously gave to fund a 10-classroom school. Construction began with the "laying of the first stone".

The kids, parents, and community watched the process with excitement and awe. Rotary funded a well at the site. Seven months later, construction was complete. The local government provided desks, chalkboards, and a wall around the perimeter of the school. On June 8th, a dedication ceremony and celebration was held, with the Provincial Governor thanking RISE for the wonderful partnership and generous contribution.

Over 1,000 children are learning in their beautiful new school. Kids are in class, excited, engaged, and focused on their studies. The community has waited for this moment for years, longing for a school and education for their children. One village leader expressed immense gratitude saying, "I did not have the chance to go to school, but I know it will change the future for our children."

WORKING TOGETHER TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE . . .

Fundraising efforts included a Brewery Tour, Fantasy Football leagues, GlobalGiving campaigns, Team RISE marathon runners, and school events, which all raised money to give kids the chance to go to school. 




SOURCE OF INCOME 2022




INCOME & EXPENSE COMPARISON 2014-2022
